

Standard Holiday/Vacation Parenting Schedule and Model Time-Sharing/Visitation Guidelines

This Standard Holiday/Vacation Parenting Schedule shall be used as a guideline to form an agreement between the parties. It shall not be used as a default schedule; however, it should be used as a foundation for establishing an agreement between the parties. The schedule ordered by the Court may or may not contain all of the elements of this Schedule or the Model Time-Sharing/Visitation Guidelines appended to the FCRPP and included here.

In the event of a conflict, the following is the order of precedence:
1. Holidays; 2. Extended periods; 3. Weekends; 4. Midweek days.
